BACKGROUND AND ASSIGNMENT

1. ORGANISATIONAL CONTEXT

The United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) is the United Nations agency responsible for human settlements, mandated to promote socially and environmentally sustainable towns and cities, with the goal of providing adequate shelter for all; within the overall objective of the United Nations to reduce poverty and promote sustainable development. The details of the Habitat Agenda, Global Programmes and the Mandate are available in the global web site at www.unhabitat.org and the Sri Lankan web site at www.unhabitat.lk.

UN-Habitat operations in Asia include activities in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Iran, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines and Sri Lanka, under supervision of the Regional Office for Asia and Pacific in Fukuoka Japan.

Since its inception in 1978, UN-Habitat has been closely working with the Government of Sri Lanka and implemented projects and programmes under the themes of, (a) Environment and climate change; (b) Post-disaster recovery and reconstruction; (c) Land and housing; (e) Disaster Risk Management; (f) Urban planning and governance; (g) Pro-poor settlement upgrading; (h) Water and sanitation; (i) Community infrastructure; and (j) Social inclusion.

The United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat), is the United Nations agency responsible for sustainable urbanization and safer human settlements that contributes to the overall objective of the United Nations to reduce poverty and promote sustainable development.

In line with the agency’s 2014-2019 Strategic Plan, UN-Habitat continues to meet the demand from member states in Asia and the Pacific to provide technical advisory services in seven focus areas:

- Urban legislation, land, and governance,
- Urban planning and design,
- Urban economy,
- Urban basic services,
- Housing and slum upgrading,
- Risk reduction and rehabilitation, and
- Research and capacity development.

2. THE PROJECT

UN-Habitat in Sri Lanka is focused on supporting governments in the formulation of policies and strategies to both create and strengthen a self-reliant management capacity at both national and local levels with the assessment of human settlement development constraints and opportunities, the identification and analysis of policy options, the mobilization of national resources and support for improving human settlements.

UN-Habitat believes that as cities grow it's vital that policy makers and city leaders have access to reliable and verifiable information in terms of urban indicators to support decision-making.

Since March 2017, the *State of Sri Lankan Cities project* has been implemented by UN-Habitat in close collaboration with the Ministry of Provincial Councils, Local Government and Sports, and the nine Provincial Capitals.

One of the outputs of the project is the "State of Sri Lankan Cities Database" www.soslc.lk: launched in December 2018, which provides a platform that allows for easy access to assist policy makers and planners to identify critical projects and policies that can be implemented to help Sri Lanka to grow as a nation. The database involves the collection and collation of information, the development of composite maps and databases, and building capacity of the LA's to use this data, which will enable better planning and encourage investment towards a better urban future for the country.

In the phase of this project, UN-Habitat hopes to expand the database to other urban governance projects, and its use to improve information and its analysis of the additional cities as a step towards promoting informed and evidenced-based policy and integrated city planning, and private and public sector investment. UN-Habitat will implement this project that is a continuation of the SoSLC in conjunction with new urban governance project partners and the Ministry of Internal and Home Affairs and Provincial Councils and Local Government. While the Ministry will have overall ownership of the database, UN-Habitat will continue to provide the technical oversight and training during this period, in discussion with its project partners.

3. FUNCTIONS /KEY RESULTS EXPECTED

The Project Coordinator – State of Sri Lankan Cities Project will be responsible for the coordination of project management and handing over of the project, under the direct supervision of the Country Programme Manager. The regular tasks include:

Project Management

- Planning and managing the requests of the particular project that SoSLC is partnering with through its UN2UN modality
- Management of project personnel in line with the project plan and approved budget
- Regular monitoring of all project activities and partners to ensure right quality and quantity within agreed time frame
- Monitoring all project targets in line with agreement and commitments to partner/government
- Implementation of the advocacy plan of SoSLC

Coordination

- Identify the available data and related gaps and ensure the available data supports the project requirement

- Coordinate with the CLG and relevant officials to Identify resources at Local Authority level capable of performing specific tasks
- Coordinate the required training and awareness programs at LA and institutional level to develop their technical skills and ensure the database is managed as per the required standard
- Co-ordinate with LA's and related institutes at the national level to ensure continuity and sustainability Assist with Advocacy Work
- Participating in discussions and understanding UN-Habitat work in current context

Assist in Project Development and strategic and integrated action plans

- Drafting of concept notes/proposals for future projects as decided at Pipeline Meetings.

Work Experience:

Experience in project management; dealing with government agencies and officials, international organizations at senior levels, in Sri Lanka. A thorough understanding of the project management functions.

Experience within the UN system and familiarity with UN rules, regulations and procedures related to field level project implementation are advantageous.
